There will be no cellular reception at the camp. We will always stay in the loop as we shall contact you via landline in times of need. Please help us help your kids experience simpler days of true camping.





#### **DIRECTIONS TO CAMP SUMMIT**

- 1. Follow the TransCanada Hwy 1 west from Vancouver. As you near Horseshoe Bay (near the BC Ferries terminal), take the exit for Highway 99 North to Squamish/Whistler (follow signs to Squamish/Whistler).
- 2. Continue on Highway 99 North you will pass through the communities of Lion's Bay, Furry Creek, & Britannia Beach. Enjoy the views along the way but be careful of traffic and construction on route.
- 3. As you arrive in Squamish you will pass through several sets of traffic lights as you continue northwards on Highway 99. Continue through all of the traffic lights you will pass the McDonald's, Tim Hortons, Walmart, Canadian Tire, and Burger King as you drive along the highway. Continue on Highway 99 North you will be leaving Squamish.
- 4. A few minutes after the last set of lights in Squamish, you will pass by the Welcome to Brackendale sign on the left hand side of the highway. At this point you be driving up a long straightaway subtle hill on the highway keep to the left hand lane. When you are nearing the top you will see an intersection you will want to turn **LEFT** here on to **Squamish Valley Road**. (Landmark: the sign for Alice Lake Provincial Campground is on the right hand side of the highway at this intersection).
- 5. Follow Squamish Valley Road (do not turn off of it) you will pass a large section of powerlines, then you will cross railway tracks and shortly after you will cross over a bridge. Directly after the bridge you will come to a Y intersection **continue following Squamish Valley Road to the LEFT**. (Paradise Valley Road is to the right DO NOT go this way).
- 6. From the Y Intersection it is 16 kms (approximately 15 mins driving at 60km per hour) to reach Camp Summit. It is paved the entire way. Along the way you will pass a large yellow smiley face ②, you will cross a one lane bridge, and then you will pass by Glacier Valley Farm & Squamish Valley Campground on the left hand side at this point you are nearing Camp Summit. Look for our sign on the LEFT hand side of the road.


Feel free to call us en route if you need clarification or further directions. Please note that you will not have cell phone reception past the yellow smiley face ③ in the Upper Squamish Valley.
