

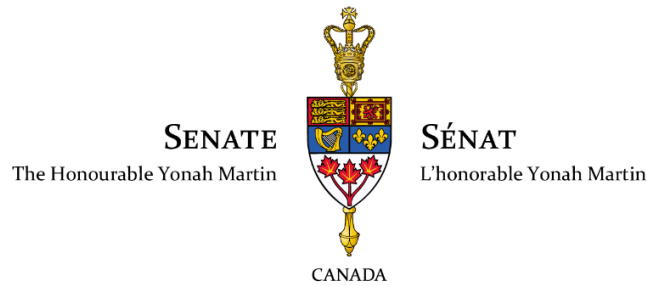

THINGS **NOT** TO BRING

- No snacks please. Wildlife can be attracted.
- Peanuts and any nut products - Camp Korea is **NOT** a peanut-free site. Please advise staff of any allergies or dietary restrictions.
- No electronic devices - We will check your bags and return electronics to parents/guardians.
- Hazardous materials (weapons, lighters, flammables)
- Drugs and alcohol



There will be no cellular reception at the camp. We will always stay in the loop as we shall contact you via landline in times of need. Please help us help your kids experience simpler days of true camping.



DIRECTIONS TO CAMP SUMMIT

1. Follow the TransCanada Hwy 1 west from Vancouver. As you near Horseshoe Bay (near the BC Ferries terminal), take the exit for Highway 99 North to Squamish/Whistler (follow signs to Squamish/Whistler).
2. Continue on Highway 99 North – you will pass through the communities of Lion’s Bay, Furry Creek, & Britannia Beach. Enjoy the views along the way – but be careful of traffic and construction on route.
3. As you arrive in Squamish you will pass through several sets of traffic lights as you continue northwards on Highway 99. Continue through all of the traffic lights – you will pass the McDonald’s, Tim Hortons, Walmart, Canadian Tire, and Burger King as you drive along the highway. Continue on Highway 99 North – you will be leaving Squamish.
4. A few minutes after the last set of lights in Squamish, you will pass by the Welcome to Brackendale sign on the left hand side of the highway. At this point you will be driving up a long straightaway subtle hill on the highway – keep to the left hand lane. When you are nearing the top you will see an intersection – you will want to turn **LEFT** here on to **Squamish Valley Road**. (Landmark: the sign for Alice Lake Provincial Campground is on the right hand side of the highway at this intersection).
5. Follow Squamish Valley Road (do not turn off of it) – you will pass a large section of powerlines, then you will cross railway tracks and shortly after you will cross over a bridge. Directly after the bridge you will come to a Y intersection – **continue following Squamish Valley Road to the LEFT**. (Paradise Valley Road is to the right – DO NOT go this way).
6. From the Y Intersection it is 16 kms (approximately 15 mins driving at 60km per hour) to reach Camp Summit. It is paved the entire way. Along the way you will pass a large yellow smiley face ☺, you will cross a one lane bridge, and then you will pass by Glacier Valley Farm & Squamish Valley Campground on the left hand side – at this point you are nearing Camp Summit. Look for our sign on the LEFT hand side of the road.

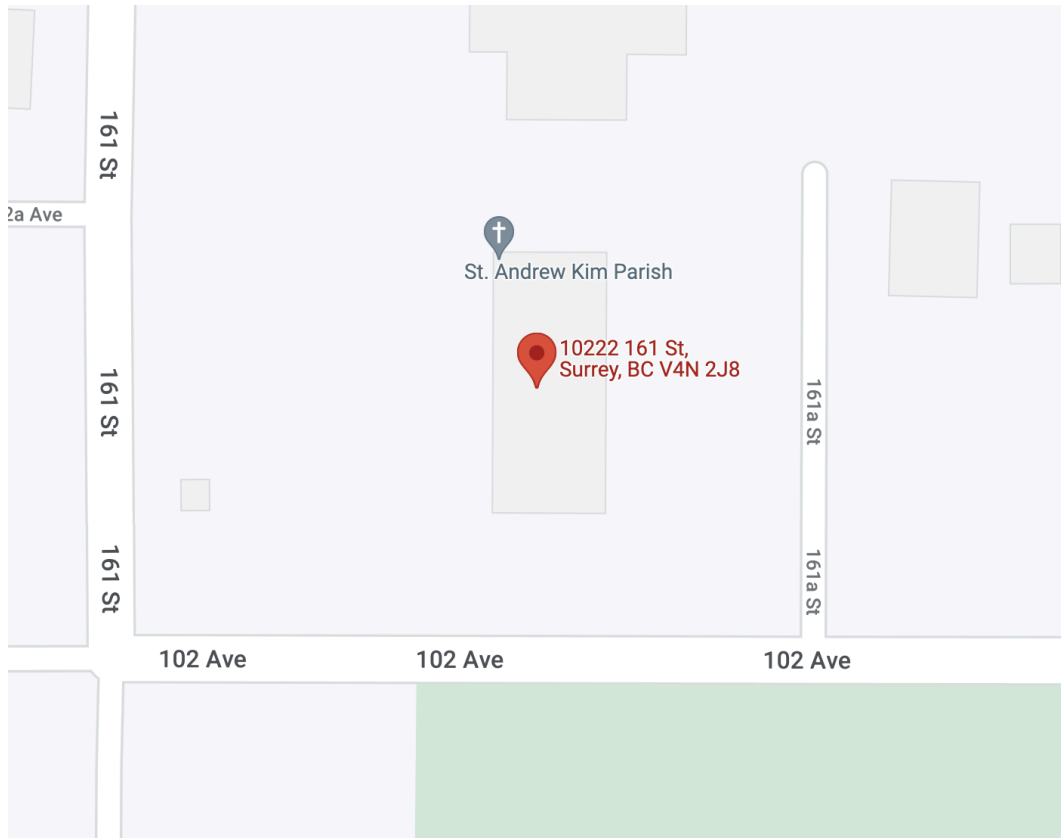

ACTIVITIES

Camp Activities may take place in a wilderness environment and may include: rock and wall climbing, rappelling, abseiling, bouldering, hiking, backpacking, high or low ropes course activities, swimming, white-water rafting, sea kayaking, canoeing, stand-up paddle boarding, mountain biking, archery, knife carving, dog sledding, snow shoeing, snowboarding, downhill and cross country skiing, fire building and cooking, camping for several nights in remote, wilderness areas in developed and undeveloped campgrounds (the "Activities"). The Activities may also include transportation, sometimes at night, to and from Camp Summit. Transportation may include water taxi, bus, and passenger vehicles. Activities and Programs may occur at alternate sites and locations including the School itself or local parks, deemed to meet the Camp Summit & BC Camping association standards. These alternate locations will be determined by both the School and Camp Summit.

I acknowledge that engaging in activities at Camp Summit require a degree of skill and knowledge different than regular activities at school and therefore my child has additional responsibilities as a participant at camp to act prudently and carefully. Certain hazards and risks are inherent to the Activities at camp and eliminating the hazards and risks would compromise the unique character of the camp experience. These inherent hazards and risks can result in loss, or damage to equipment, personal property, or injury, illness or death.

In addition to the hazards and risks described above, the hazards and risks of the Activities may also include, but are not limited to, the following: acts of other participants (including from the failure of other participants to follow instructions or obey safety regulations), manufacturers defects or malfunctions in equipment, weather conditions (including unforeseen, inclement or temperate weather), consumption of food and drink, fire, first aid, emergency treatment, or other services provided.

Camp Summit will not have medical personnel, other than Wilderness First Responder and/or OFA Level 2 certified staff, at the location of the camp Activities or at Camp Summit.

NOTICE TO PARENT/GUARDIAN

It is a condition to the Child's participation in the Activities, that you, the undersigned Parent/Guardian of the Child, must carefully read and understand this document and sign it to acknowledge that you have read and understand it and that you understand the Child's participation in the Activities will expose the Child to risks of harm.

PARENT/GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITY OF CHILD

I, the undersigned Parent/Guardian of the Child, understand and accept that, in respect of the Child's participation in the Activities, it is my responsibility (1) to ensure that I consider and understand the risks, dangers, hazards and potential harm inherent in the Activities, (2) to determine, taking into consideration those risks and the Child's behavioural characteristics, physical health and abilities, whether the Child should be allowed to participate in the Activities, (3) to have read and completed in full the Medical Form provided by Camp Summit, (4) to have read the clothing and equipment list provided by Camp Summit, and I accept full responsibility for inadequate clothing or equipment and for clothing and equipment which I fail to provide to the Child, (5) to contact the staff of Camp Summit to more fully explain to the nature and physical demands of the Activities and the risks, dangers, hazards and potential harm inherent in the Activities.

AWARE OF RISKS

I AM AWARE OF AND NOW FREELY ACCEPT THE RISKS TO THE CHILD IN CONNECTION WITH HIS OR HER PARTICIPATION IN THE ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING AS FOLLOWS:

- (1) the Child's participation in the Activities, even if the Child possesses behavioural characteristics, physical health and abilities appropriate for the Activities, poses risks of harm to the Child;
- (2) the nature of the Activities are such that Camp Summit cannot identify all risks associated with the Activities and cannot guarantee that Camp Summit staff participating in the Activities will not make errors therein or that other children participating in the activities will not cause injuries therein that staff can or might be able to prevent.

I, THE UNDERSIGNED PARENT/GUARDIAN, AM THE PARENT AND/OR LEGAL GUARDIAN OF THE CHILD AND FOR THE CHILD I HEREBY CONSENT TO HIM OR HER PARTICIPATING IN THE ACTIVITIES.

In signing this document and permitting the Child to participate in the Activities, I do not rely upon any oral and written statements, promises or other communications made by Camp Summit other than set out in this document. This document will be exclusively governed by and interpreted in accordance with the law of British Columbia and no court outside British Columbia will have any jurisdiction over this Consent, the Activities, or any other matter arising from them.
